RESOLUTION OF GOVERNMENT

It has been observed that the quality of touring done by Mamlatdars and Mahalkaris has of late considerably declined. Government had therefore under consideration the question of prescribing some standard of touring for taluka and mahal officers with a view to improving the quality of their touring and simultaneously to facilitate closer supervision and more direct contact with villagers and their needs. Government is now pleased to prescribe a standard of 20 days touring with a minimum of 12 night halts per mensem during the fair weather and 10 days of touring with 6 night halts per mensem during the monsoon (July to September). Halts outside ~~the~~ Headquarters should be of duration not less than three nights at one and the same village and there should be not less than two such halts each month. Touring will include not only the nights spent out of headquarters but also the days on which a Mamlatdar/Mahalkari/returns to headquarters after visiting or inspecting one or two villages.
