Memorandum No. L.R. 847, dated the 8th February 1954 from the Settlement Commissioner and Director of Land Records and its accompaniment.

" Returned with compliments.

2. I agree that, due to increase of jurisdiction and work on account of the merger of states, the Collectors concerned require relief in the inspection work. The proposal of the Deputy Secretary (Inspection), (that the Collectors should take one Taluka from each Prant for "Jamabandi" and the other taluka for "Inspection") would not solve the problem in all cases. Where the No. of Prants is large (e.g. in Mehsana, Surat, Ratnagiri, Bijapur, Dharwar Districts), the No. of talukas for inspection would still be as many as 8 and in some cases the No. would be larger than it is at present. I would therefore, suggest that in the Districts having 11 talukas or less the existing practice may continue, (as the No. of talukas for inspection in their case would be only 5/6 or less). Where the No. of talukas is, however, 12 or more, the Collector may take one taluka from each Prant for "Jamabandi" (except where a prant consists of only 1 taluka e.g. Kolaba and Poona Districts, where the Jamabandi taluka can be taken up every 3rd year) and the others for inspection work, in such rotation that every taluka would come under inspection at least once in 3 years, and the No. of talukas inspected each year would not be less than five. The enclosed comparative statement would show how the arrangement would work and provide

in the case of all heavily worked districts (having more

(Fifth Edition) requires that the Collector of district should visit Talukas for inspection and Jamabandi every year in such a manner that no Taluka is left unvisited for two seasons. In view of the increase in the size of districts and also general increase in work it may now be difficult for some Collectors to achieve this standard (4) Government is, therefore, pleased to direct that the existing practice should be continued only in districts having 2 sub-divisions (with 11 Talukas or less) and that in districts where the number of sub-divisions is 3 or more, the Collector should take one Taluka from each Prant for Jamabandi and another for inspection in such rotation that every Taluka in each Prant is visited either for Jamabandi or office inspection, at least once in 3 years. The number of Talukas in the district visited by a Collector each year for office inspection or Jamabandi should not be less than five. In cases where a Prant consists of only one Taluka, the Jamabandi of that Taluka should be taken up by the Collector every third year.

2. The Settlement Commissioner and Director of Land Records should be requested to issue the necessary correction slip to the Revenue Accounts Manual.
